This year, Patterson will be instituting a "No Cell Phone Policy" while students are in school. Students will be required to:

- 1. Turn in their cell phones when they arrive to school. Phones will be signed in by the student, stored and locked up in the main office by a school administrator.
- 2. Phones will be returned to students prior to their leaving at the end of the school day.
- 3. Should a student need to contact their parent, they may utilize the phone in the main office.

If a student is found to have a cell phone in their possession during the school day, it will be:

- 1. Confiscated by an adult and turned in to a school administrator.
- 2. Cell phones will not be returned to the student.
- 3. Cell phones can **ONLY** be picked up by the parent. Family members (e.g. Older Siblings, Aunts, Uncles, Cousins, etc...) **WILL NOT** be permitted to pick up a students' phone on behalf of the parent.

Discipline Policy, will be suspended from school for their actions.

OR

Parents, you may elect for your child NOT to bring a cell phone to school at all.

Please remember not to send balls, toys, games, cellphones or personal items with students. Staff WILL NOT be responsible for any loss, stolen or broken items!!!

SCH L NURSE

- Many of our students for various reasons (e.g. asthma, allergies, etc...)
 may require the School Nurse to administer medication during the school
 day; as a result, it is VERY IMPORTANT that we not only have the necessary
 completed Doctor's Order on file, but also the medication that can be
 administered to your child.
- If your child requires an inhaler for asthma, has food allergies and requires an epipen, etc... please make sure that the School Nurse is made aware of this.
- Please note that students CAN NOT self-medicate while they are in school.
- We want to ensure their medical wellbeing and MUST have the necessary documents and medication on file in order for the School Nurse to administer the medication.
- Please note that if we DO NOT have the necessary documents and medication on file and it has been determined that your child requires IMMEDIATE medical attention outside of the local school, we will call 911 and have your child transported to the nearest medical facility.
- Please contact the school nurse to secure the forms that your child's doctor will need to complete, as well as, if you have questions or concerns.
- ALL medication MUST be brought in by the parent and given DIRECTLY to the School Nurse.



On the back is the 2019 Science Fair Timeline. The classroom teacher will give guidance and feedback, but this is a home-based project and all experiments are to be done at home.



March 1st - March 15th

All students and teachers create a mini class science fair project or students and teacher explore the components of a science fair project and the Scientific Method. Additionally, all 3rd – 5th grade students should select a proposed science fair topic during this time.

March 1st - March 15th

Student:

- Student decides what the science fair topic will be
- Develops testable question (problem statement)
- Develops hypothesis
- Identifies Variables (Independent, Dependent, Constant)

March 16th - April 6th

Student:

- Identifies materials needed for investigation
- Writes (or copies) procedure and begins experiment
- Receives science fair board and headers
- Continues Experiment and ON-GOING OBSERVATIONS
- Collect and organizes data into tables and graphs
- **Begins Conclusion**
- Begins to prepare display board. 3rd 5th Grade STUDENTS TAKE SCIENCE FAIR BOARDS HOME. Boards w/header costs \$5.

April 9th – April 20th

Student:

Completes Conclusion and all components of display board (problem, hypothesis, materials, procedure, data, tables, graphs, pictures, results, conclusion)

April 23rd - April 30th

Student:

 Completes assembly of display board (Check and double check. Read and reread!)

May 2nd

Student and class projects are due to Ms. Cornish or Ms. Donahue by 3:30pm on May 1st. Projects submitted after 8:30am on May 2nd will not be considered for judging and 10 points will be subtracted from the overall grade.

SCORING RUBRIC

Judges will score projects 0 – 4 (Zero is the lowest number of points. 4 is the highest) in the following areas:

Clear & Specific PROBLEM & HYPOTHESIS Is CONCLUSION supported by DATA Is topic or approach original

Clear & Thorough PROCEDURE & DATA* Is CONCLUSION relevant to HYPOTHESIS

Appearance of display

**Can student clearly explain their project?

Does student demonstrate a thorough understanding of their project?

* DATA includes logs, graphs, tables, & photos.

** Teachers must select 1 or 2 students to present their class project to the judges.

Science Fair & Judging on Thursday, May 2nd

- 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place student winners in each of the grades: 3, 4, and 5.
- 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place class awards to the top 3 pre-school through 2nd grade projects

All projects will receive a certificate for participation. Third-fifth grade students will also receive a project grade from the judges. Grades will be given to the homeroom teacher.

Remember: This grade will be factored into the 4th Advisory SCIENCE report card!

Parents may view projects on the morning of May 2ndprior to judging at 9:30am and/or outside of classrooms until May 10th...

Level of difficulty/challenge for grade level
